CORRIGENDUM

CIRCULAR

The Government of West Bengal in the Labour Department has fixed minimum rates of wages in the employment of **Hotels and Restaurants including Boarding Houses, Eating Houses, Canteens, Clubs and Guest Houses** in the State of West Bengal as per notification number Labr/655/(Law)/MW/2W-32/13 Dated 29.12.2016, as published in the Kolkata Gazette Extraordinary dt. 30.12.2016.

- (a) Now, with reference to the said notification, the following shall be the minimum rates of wages in the said employment for the period from **01st July 2019 to 31st December 2019**.

Categories of Employees	Monthly Minimum Rates of Wages	
	Zone A	Zone B
Unskilled	Rs.8177.00	Rs.7176.00
Semi-Skilled	Rs.8996.00	Rs.7891.00
Skilled	Rs.9895.00	Rs.8681.00
Highly Skilled	Rs.10884.00	Rs.9551.00

- (b) **Implementing areas: Zone 'A'**=(i) Areas under Municipal Corporations, Municipalities, notified Areas/ Authorities, Development Authorities, Thermal Power Plants Areas including Industrial Township Areas;
Zone 'B'=Rest of the West Bengal.
- (c) The classification of employees in the above employment is as follows:-
Unskilled: Waiter, Washman, Peon, Utility Worker, Helper, Cleaner, Sweeper, Canteen Boy;
Semi-skilled: Helper of Technician Service, Waiter Grade-I, Steward, Assistant Supervisor;
Skilled: Cook, Chief Cashier, Accountant, Bar Tender, Assistant Manager;
Highly Skilled: Manager, Chief Executive.
- (d) To arrive at daily rates, monthly rates shall have to be divided by 26 and to be rounded off to the nearest rupee and to arrive at weekly rates, daily rates shall have to be multiplied by 6.
- (e) A normal working day shall consist of eight and half hours of work including interval for half-an-hour for rest.

- (f) One day in any period of seven days as may suit the local convenience shall be the day of weekly rest.

- (g) The minimum rates of wages include the wages for weekly day of rest. Payment for work done on the day of weekly rest and for work done beyond the normal working hours shall be double the ordinary rate of wages.
- (h) Where the existing rates of wages of any employee based on contract or agreement or otherwise are higher than the rates notified herein, the higher rates shall be protected and treated as minimum rates of wages applicable for the purpose of this notification to such employees.
- (i) The minimum rates of wages are applicable to employees employed by contractors also.
- (j) The minimum rates of wages for disabled persons shall be same as payable to the workers of appropriate category.
- (k) The men and women employees shall get the same rates of wages for same work or work of similar nature.
- (l) The minimum rates of wages and Variable Dearness Allowance, if any, both together shall constitute the minimum rates of wages to be enforceable under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (11 of 1948).

CIRCULAR

- (a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages in the employment of **Hotels and Restaurants including Boarding Houses and Eating Houses employing not more than 20 persons** in the State of West Bengal as per notification number 107-MW/2W-12/2010 dated 09.04.2012. These rates have become effective from **1st July, 2019 to 31st December, 2019.**

Categories of Employees	Monthly Minimum Rates of Wages	
	Zone A	Zone B
Unskilled	Rs.8177.00	Rs.7176.00
Semi-Skilled	Rs.8996.00	Rs.7891.00
Skilled	Rs.9895.00	Rs.8681.00

The classification of employees is as follows:-

- Unskilled Workers:** Table boy, Kitchen helper, Sweeper/Cleaner and Housing keeping boy, Waiter, Security Guard.
- Semi-skilled workers :** Tea maker, Steward, Cook, Ice-cream maker.
- Skilled Workers :** Senior Cook, Receptionist, Cash Sarkar, Store Keeper, Junior Clerk/ Typist, Computer operator.
- Highly Skilled Workers:** Kitchen Master, Head Cook, Cashier, Accountant, Senior Clerk.

Implementing areas: Zone 'A'=(i) Areas Notified under Kolkata Metropolitan Development Authority(KMDA), (ii) Asansol Municipal Corporation, (iii) Durgapur Municipal Corporation, (iv) Siliguri Municipal Corporation, (v) Digha-Shankarpur Development Authority, (vi) Thermal Power plant areas including Township areas, (vii) All the Municipal areas in different Districts, (viii) All the Sub-Divisions in the districts of Howrah, Hoogly, Burdwan and 24- Parganas (N)[excluding Barasat and Basirhat], (ix) Alipur Sub-Division and BaruipurhuSub-Division in the district of 24-Parganas(S), (x) MidnaporeSadar Sub-Division and Kharagpur Sub-Division in the district of West Midnapore, (xi) Siliguri sub-division in the district of Darjeeling, (xii) Bankura Sub-Division and Bisnupur Sub-division in the district of Bankura, and (xiii) Raghunathpur Sub-Division in the district of Purulia;

Zone B=Rest of West Bengal.

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- (a) To arrive at daily rates, monthly rates will have to be divided by 26 and to be rounded off to the nearest rupee and to arrive at weekly rates, daily rates will have to be multiplied by 6;
- (b) A normal working day shall consist of eight and half hours of work including interval for half-an-hour for rest;
- (c) One day in any period of seven days as may suit the local convenience shall be the day of weekly rest;
- (d) The minimum rates of wages include the wages for weekly day of rest. Payment for work done on the day of weekly rest and for work done beyond the normal working hours shall be double the ordinary rate of wages.;
